Baseline party identification is the respondent's most recent answer given prior to March 15, 2022, and is weighted to the estimated distribution at that time (33% Democratic, 28% Republican). The weights range from 0.32 to 4.643, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.427.
