Yashika Bageerathi came to Britain in 2011 with her family when her mother fled Mauritius to escape a physically abusive relative. Her family claimed asylum in Britain last year. She has been attending school in Britain, where she is described as hard-working and popular, is about to take her A Levels and has been given offers to study at good universities. Yashika is 19 years old and because she is an adult her application for asylum was treated separately to her family. Her claim for asylum has not been upheld, and she is due to be deported to Mauritius. Mauritius itself is a democracy and generally has a good record of human rights. Do you think Yashika Bageerathi should be deported, or should she be allowed to remain in Britain?
