

YouGov / Telegraph Survey on the European Union

YouGov questioned 3771 adults aged 18+ throughout Britain online between 24th and 26th May 2005.

As you probably know, the Government intends at some time in the future to hold a referendum on the proposed European constitution. The actual question to be asked has now been published and reads: 'Should the United Kingdom approve the treaty establishing a constitution for the European Union?'
