Parliament currently has two chambers, the House of Commons and the House of Lords.

Currently the House of Lords is mostly made up of people appointed by the political parties or by the House of Lords Appointments Commission, which nominates independent Lords. The House of Lords also has seats for senior Church of England bishops and 92 remaining hereditary peers.

The Government have proposed replacing the House of Lords with a mainly elected House of Lords. 360 members of the House of Lords would be elected by proportional representation for fifteen years, with a third of the House elected every five years. Ninety independent Lords would continue to be appointed, and 12 bishops would keep their seats. The remaining hereditary peers would be abolished.
