Some people say a referendum should be held on changing voting system for electing Britain's Members of Parliament.

At the moment, under first-past-the-post (FPTP), voters select ONE candidate, and the candidate with the most votes wins.

It has been suggested that this system should be replaced by the Alternative Vote (AV). Voters would RANK a number of candidates from a list. If a candidate wins more than half of the '1st' votes, a winner is declared. If not, the least popular candidates are eliminated from the contest, and their supporters' subsequent preferences counted and shared accordingly between the remaining candidates. This process continues until an outright winner is declared.

Supporters of AV say it means that each MP would have the support of at least half of his or her local voters; something FPTP does not guarantee. Others say there is no need to change a system that is easy to understand and generally works well, while some suggest that AV does not go far enough, and that Britain should have a much more proportional voting system.
