Unweighted Sample

A Universal Basic Income is a fixed payment, paid equally by the government to \*\*every\*\* citizen of a country, \*\*regardless of whether they are in work or out of work\*\*, paid for by general taxes and removing some other benefits. People have suggested it could be set at different levels, but in an experiment in Finland in 2017 it was set at €560 a month (£470 a month).

Some people say that a universal basic income would improve quality of life, significantly reduce poverty and increase economic growth, because people would be more financially secure and subsequently take more risks that are currently only available to those who have disposable income - higher education, further training for high-skilled jobs, or entrepreneurship. Others say that a universal basic income is too expensive, will lead to a decline in economic productivity as people may not want to work if their income is guaranteed, and is an unfair system, since it pays out equally to people regardless of how much they contribute to society.
