

Pupils' attainment and progress in national examinations and assessments at the end of key stage 4 have been below national averages over time. Recent improvements in key stage 3 mean that many pupils are beginning to build their knowledge and skills more effectively across subjects.

Pupils' progress in key stage 4 remains uneven. Some pupils, including some with SEND, continue to have gaps in their basic literacy and numeracy. This limits their access to parts of the curriculum. As a result, some pupils do not make the progress that they should.
