HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR CALCULATED

June 24, 2018

The CBS News 2018 Battleground Tracker is a series of panel studies in the U.S., This national poll was conducted by YouGov using a nationally representative sample of 2,063 U.S. adults between June 21-22, 2018.

1,677 respondents were recontacted from panelists who had completed the 2017-18 Nation Tracker, either in the May wave between May 16-18, 2018, in the January wave between January 10–12, 2018, in the October wave between October 11–13, 2017, the July wave between July 26–28, 2017, the May wave between May 17–19, the March wave between March 15–19, 2017, or the February Wave between February 8–10, 2017. The remaining 386 respondents were selected from 12,317 panelists who had completed a baseline interview conducted between January – May 2017.

Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in panel to be representative of all U.S. adults according to gender, age, race, education, and region (based on the American Community Survey, conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census). The responding sample was then weighted based on gender, age, race, education, 2012 and 2016 Presidential vote. The weights range from 0.1 to 4.8, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.7.

The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 2.6%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + \mathsf{CV}^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
