ing sample matching. A random sample (stratified by gender, age, race, education, and region) was selected from the 2018 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2018 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.

Weighting The sample was weighted based on gender, age, race, education,

and both 2016 and 2020 Presidential votes (or non-votes). The weights range from 0.315 to 4.642, with a mean of one and a standard

deviation of 0.401.
