49. In 1982, President Reagan signed a law that directed the Department of Energy to establish a location for the permanent storage of radioactive waste from nuclear powerplants. In 1987, Congress designated Yucca Mountain in Nevada as the national nuclear waste disposal location. In 2002, Congress approved the Yucca Mountain nuclear waste respository project. However, in 2011, in the face of severe local objections - including the Nevada congressional delegation (with former Democratic Senate Leader Harry Reid), Congress and the Obama administration defunded the project as part of a continuing resolution to fund the federal government. In the last week, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a bipartisan, comprehensive nuclear waste bill, by a margin of 340-72, that among other things includes restoring funding to the Yucca Mountain nuclear waste respository project.
