**Interviewing Dates** November 6 - 7, 2024

**Target population** Registered voters in the U.S., age 18 and over

Sampling method Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in panel to be repre-

sentative of registered voters in the U.S.

Weighting The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, educa-

tion, 2024 presidential vote, 2020 election turnout and presidential vote, and baseline party identification. Demographic weighting targets come from the 2019 American Community Survey. 2024 presidential vote, at time of weighting was estimated to be 48% Harris and 50% Trump. Baseline party identification is the respondent's most recent answer given around November 1, 2022, and is weighted to the estimated distribution at that time (33% Democratic, 31% Republican). The weights range from 0.13 to 6.264, with a mean of one and

a standard deviation of 0.564.
