Polling Methodology and Margin of Error Calculation

The Los Angeles Times Poll was conducted by YouGov using a representative sample of 760 adults living in California interviewed online between July 19 – 27, 2023.

The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, Spanish language use, education, party identification, current voter registration status, 2020 election turnout and Presidential vote. Demographic weighting targets come from the 2019 American Community Survey. Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in panel to be representative of all adults living in California. The weights range from 0.1 to 7.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 1.0.

The questionnaire was offered in both English and Spanish.

The *margin of error* (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 5.2%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + CV^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
