Target population Registered Voters in New Jersey

Sample 1,163 New Jersey registered voters were recruited from the

New Jersey voter list by sending text messages. All interviews were conducted online using YouGov's web-based survey system. Questions are reported among likely voters.

Weighting The sample was weighted to gender, age, party registra-

tion, past election turnout, in-state geography (using the current New Jersey voter list) and imputed education, race, and 2024 vote choice. Turnout probabilities based on self-reported vote likelihood were assigned to each person in the sample and the product of the base weight and turnout probability was used to obtain results for likely voters. Weights were computed using the method of raking. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.5, with a coefficient of variation of 1.43.
