A random sample (stratified by gender, age, race, education, geographic region, and voter registration) was selected from the 2014 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2014 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
Weighting	The sample was weighted using propensity scores based on gender, age, race, education, geographic region, and 2012 Presidential vote. The weights range from 0.177 to 5.273, with a mean of one and a standard deviation of 0.628.
