## 1. Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Bill Cosby?

Very favorable	7%
Somewhat favorable	16%
Somewhat unfavorable	20%
Very unfavorable	40%
Don't know	18%

## 2. How much have you heard about the Pennsylvania Supreme Court overturning the sexual assault conviction of Bill Cosby?

A lot	28%
A little	55%
Nothing at all	17%

## 3. The 2018 sexual assault conviction of Bill Cosby was overturned by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court after the court ruled that a previous non-prosecution agreement meant that Cosby should not have been charged in the case. He served three years in prison before being released. Do you support or oppose the sexual assault conviction of Bill Cosby being overturned?

## 4. Do you believe Bill Cosby committed the sexual assault acts he was accused of?

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<b>Interviewing Dates</b>	July 2 - 6, 2021
<b>Target population</b>	U.S. Citizens, aged 18 and over.
<b>Sampling method</b>	Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching. A random sample (stratified by gender, age, race, education, geographic region, and voter registration) was selected from the 2016 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2016 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
<b>Weighting</b>	The sample was weighted based on gender, age, race, education, news interest, and 2016 Presidential vote (or non-vote). The weights range from 0.14 to 5.455, with a mean of one and a standard deviation of 0.444.
<b>Number of respondents</b>	1000
<b>Margin of error</b>	± 3.4% (adjusted for weighting)
<b>Survey mode</b>	Web-based interviews
<b>Questions not reported</b>	59 questions not reported.
