Sample 1000 U.S. Adult Citizens
Conducted June 10 - 14, 2022
Margin of Error ±3.6%

1. How often do you agree to plans far in advance only to realize closer to the date that you don't want to participate?

Very often	11%
Somewhat often	25%
Not very often	49%
Never	8%
Not sure	7%

2. Do you think that the COVID-19 pandemic has made it more acceptable or less acceptable for people to cancel plans at the last minute?

More acceptable	53%
Less acceptable	8%
No change	26%
Not sure	13%

3. How understanding would you be of a friend canceling a trip with you at the last minute because they are nervous about catching COVID?

Very understanding	34%
Somewhat understanding	36%
Not very understanding	16%
Not at all understanding	8%
Not sure	7%

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Interviewing Dates	June 10 - 14, 2022
Target population	U.S. Citizens, aged 18 and over.
Sampling method	Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching. A random sample (stratified by gender, age, race, education, geographic region, and voter registration) was selected from the 2018 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2018 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
Weighting	The sample was weighted based on gender, age, race, education, news interest, and 2020 Presidential vote (or non-vote). The weights range from 0.243 to 6.523, with a mean of one and a standard deviation of 0.569.

Margin of error	± 3.6% (adjusted for weighting)
