Sample 1000 U.S. Adult Citizens  
 Conducted May 31 - June 3, 2022  
 Margin of Error ±3.4%

## 1. Do you or does anyone in your household own a gun?

Personally own a gun ..... 26%  
 Don't personally own a gun, but someone in the household owns a gun ..... 16%  
 No one in the household owns a gun ..... 50%  
 Not sure ..... 8%

## 2. In general, do you think that people should or should not be allowed to own firearms?

Should ..... 67%  
 Should not ..... 21%  
 Not sure ..... 12%

## 3. In general, do you think that people should or should not be allowed to carry firearms in public places?

Should ..... 45%  
 Should not ..... 42%  
 Not sure ..... 13%

## 4. Do you think that the average American can be trusted with a firearm?

Yes ..... 47%  
 No ..... 36%  
 Not sure ..... 17%

<b>Interviewing Dates</b>	May 31 - June 3, 2022
<b>Target population</b>	U.S. Citizens, aged 18 and over.
<b>Sampling method</b>	Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching. A random sample (stratified by gender, age, race, education, geographic region, and voter registration) was selected from the 2018 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2018 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
<b>Weighting</b>	The sample was weighted based on gender, age, race, education, news interest, and 2020 Presidential vote (or non-vote). The weights range from 0.273 to 5.362, with a mean of one and a standard deviation of 0.414.
<b>Number of respondents</b>	1000
<b>Margin of error</b>	± 3.4% (adjusted for weighting)
<b>Survey mode</b>	Web-based interviews
<b>Questions not reported</b>	60 questions not reported.
