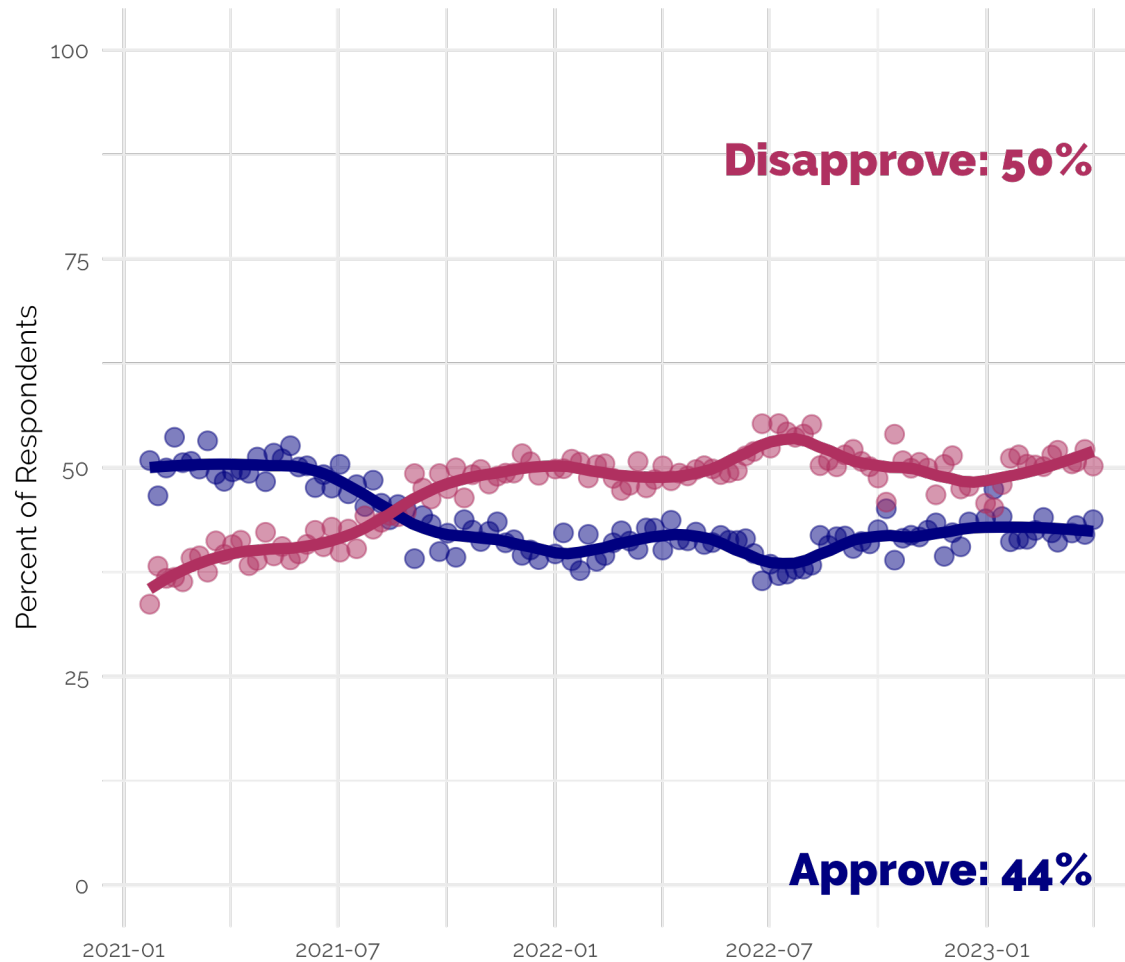


Figure 1: Biden Approval – All Adults

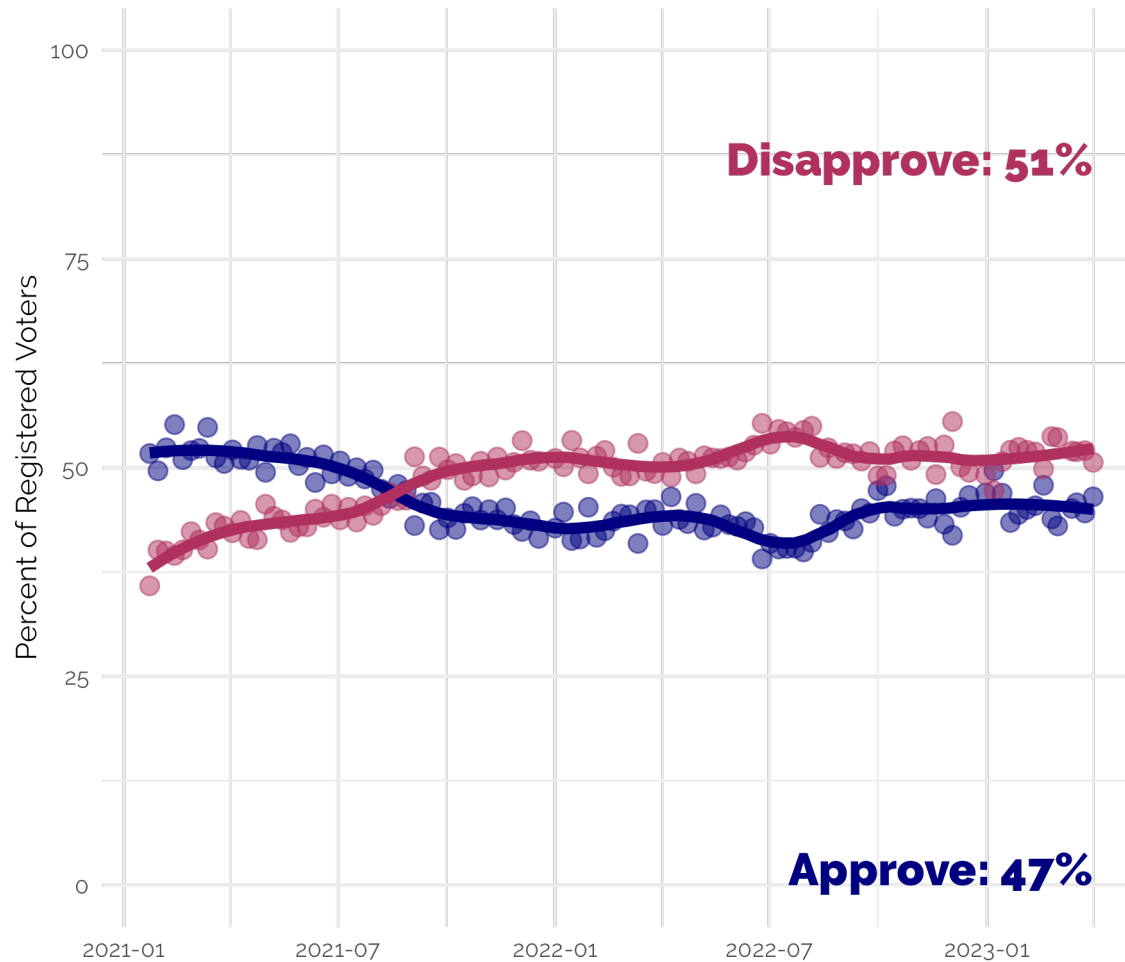


Figure 2: Biden Approval – Registered Voters

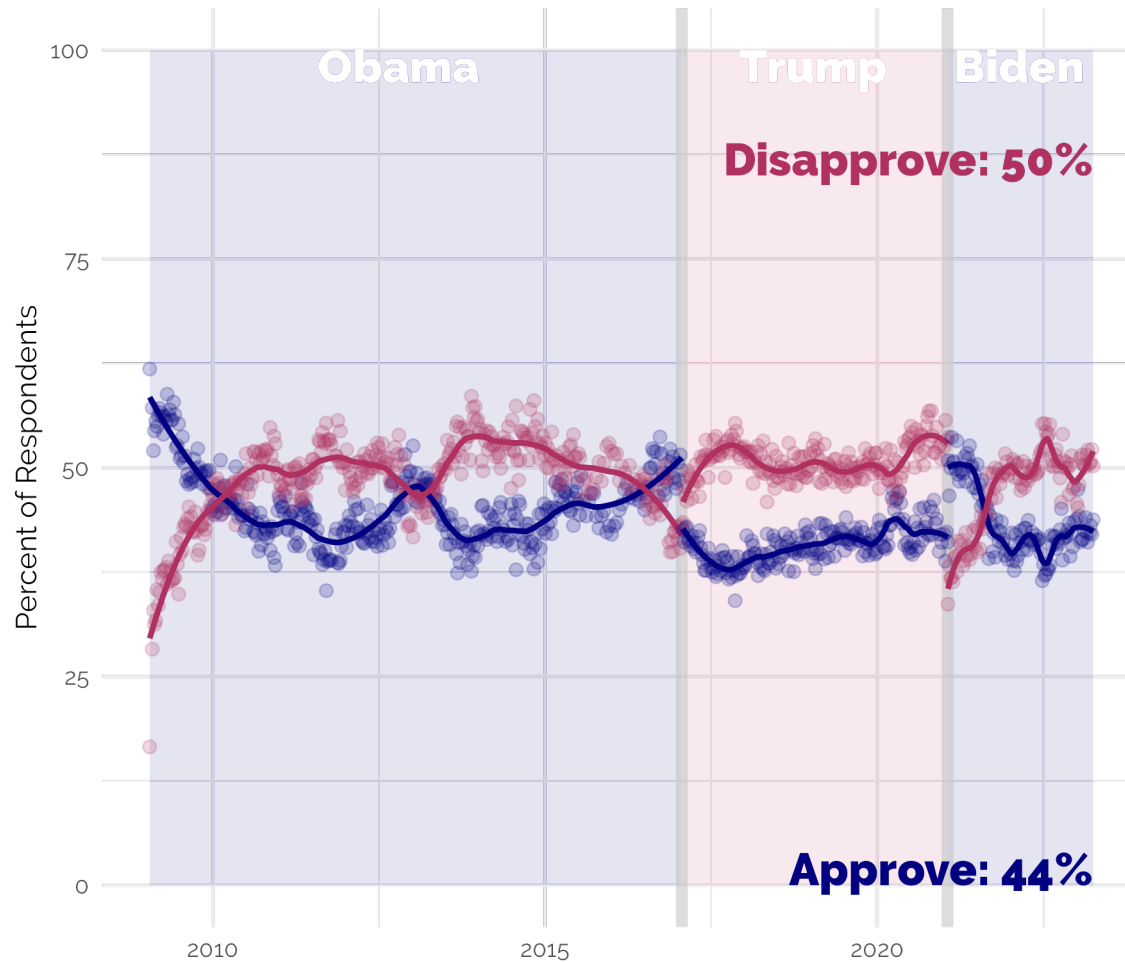


Figure 3: Presidential Approval since 2009 – All Adults

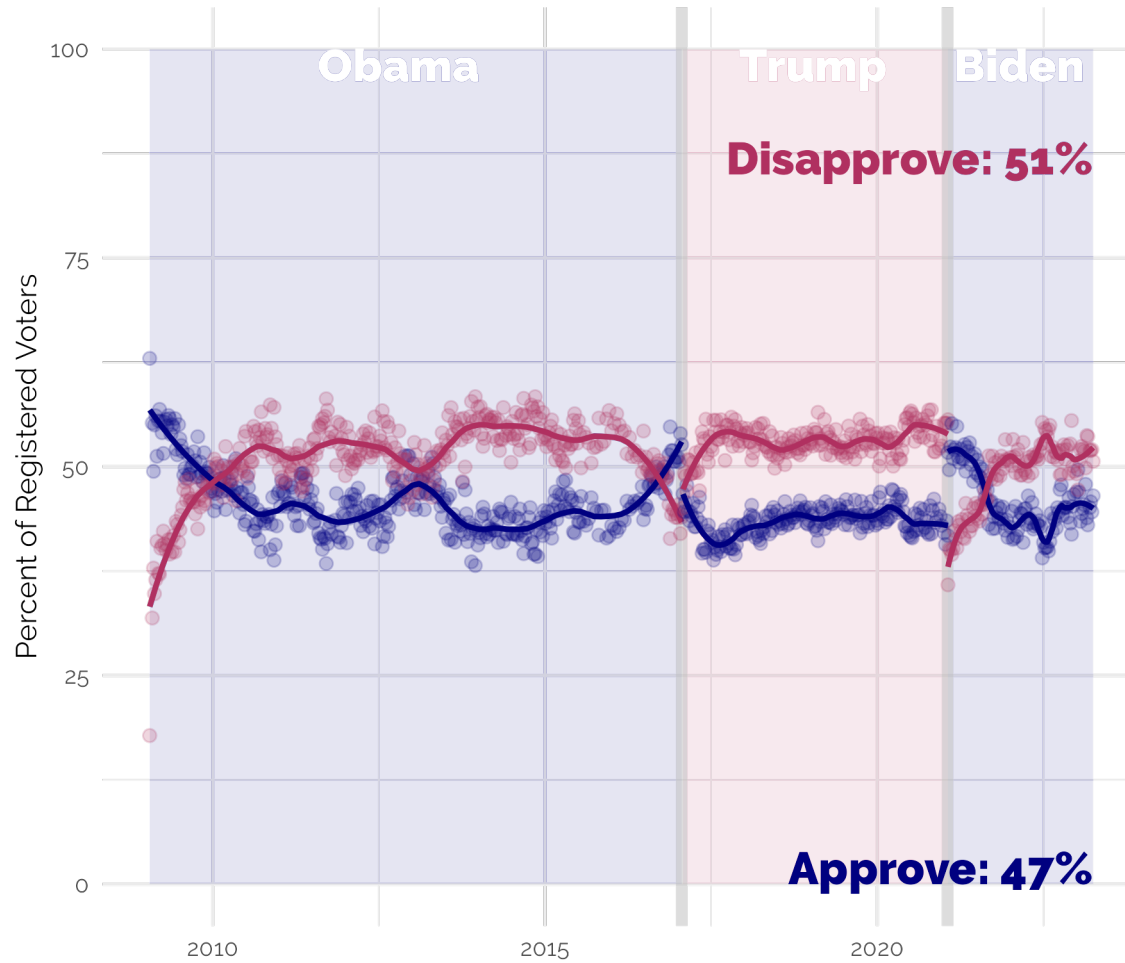


Figure 4: Presidential Approval since 2009 – Registered Voters

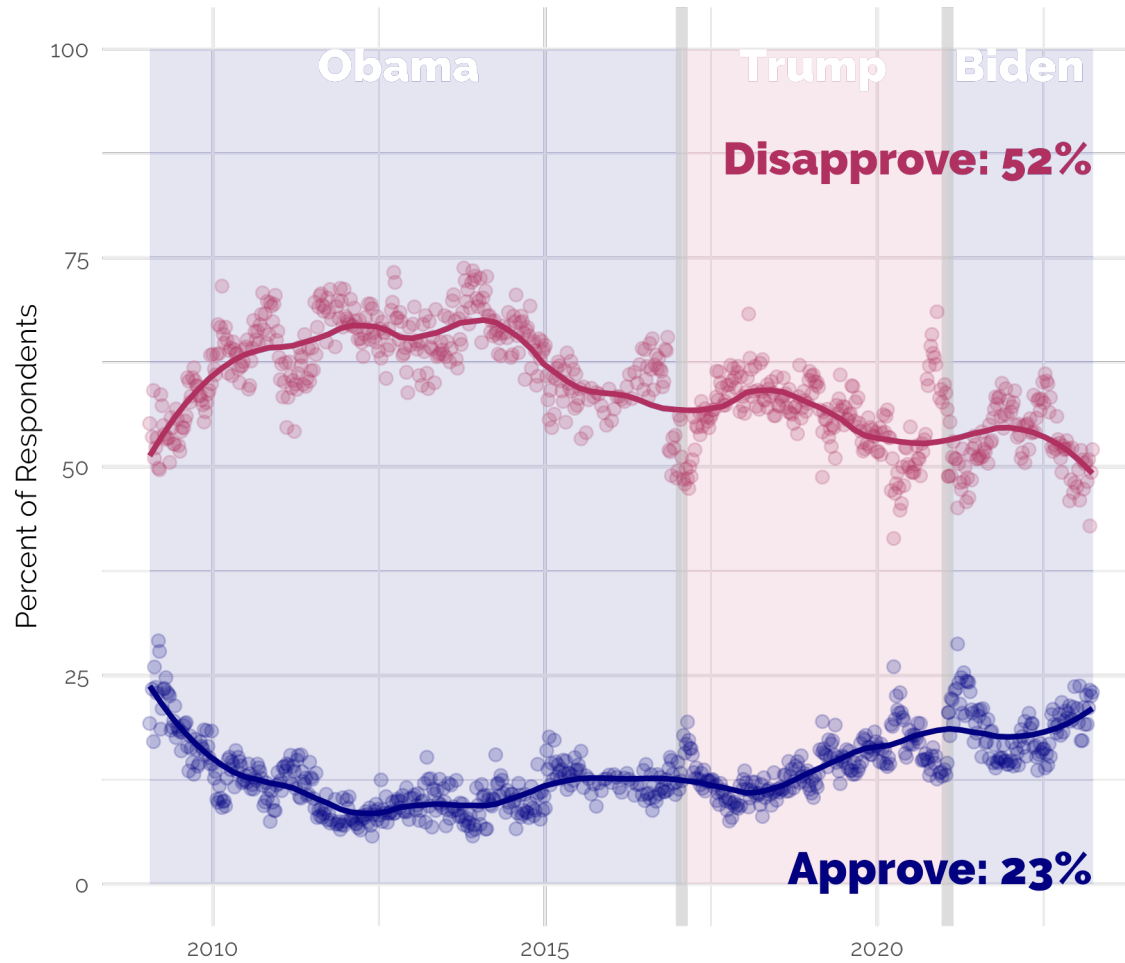


Figure 5: Congressional Approval – All Adults

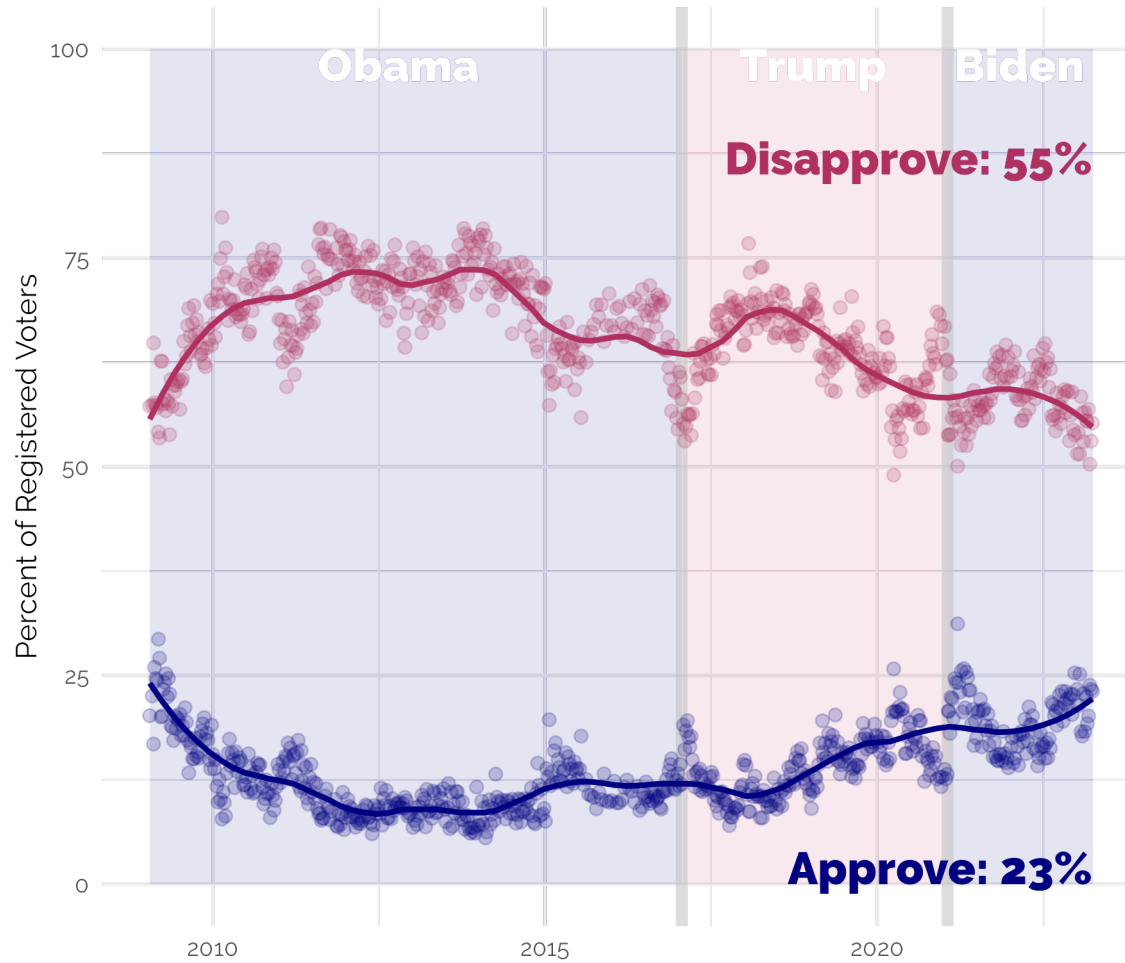


Figure 6: Congressional Approval – Registered Voters

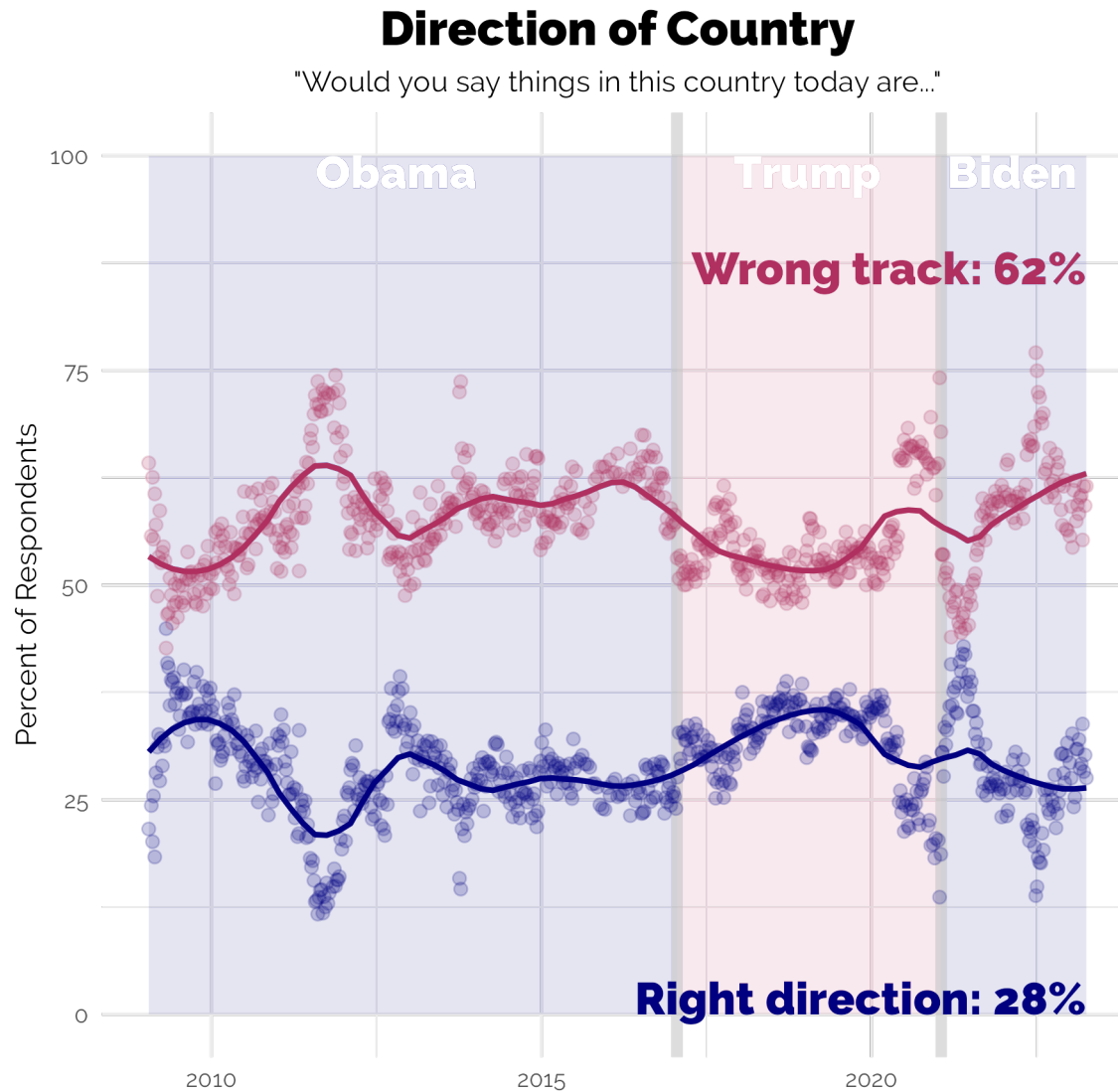


Figure 7: Direction of Country – All Adults

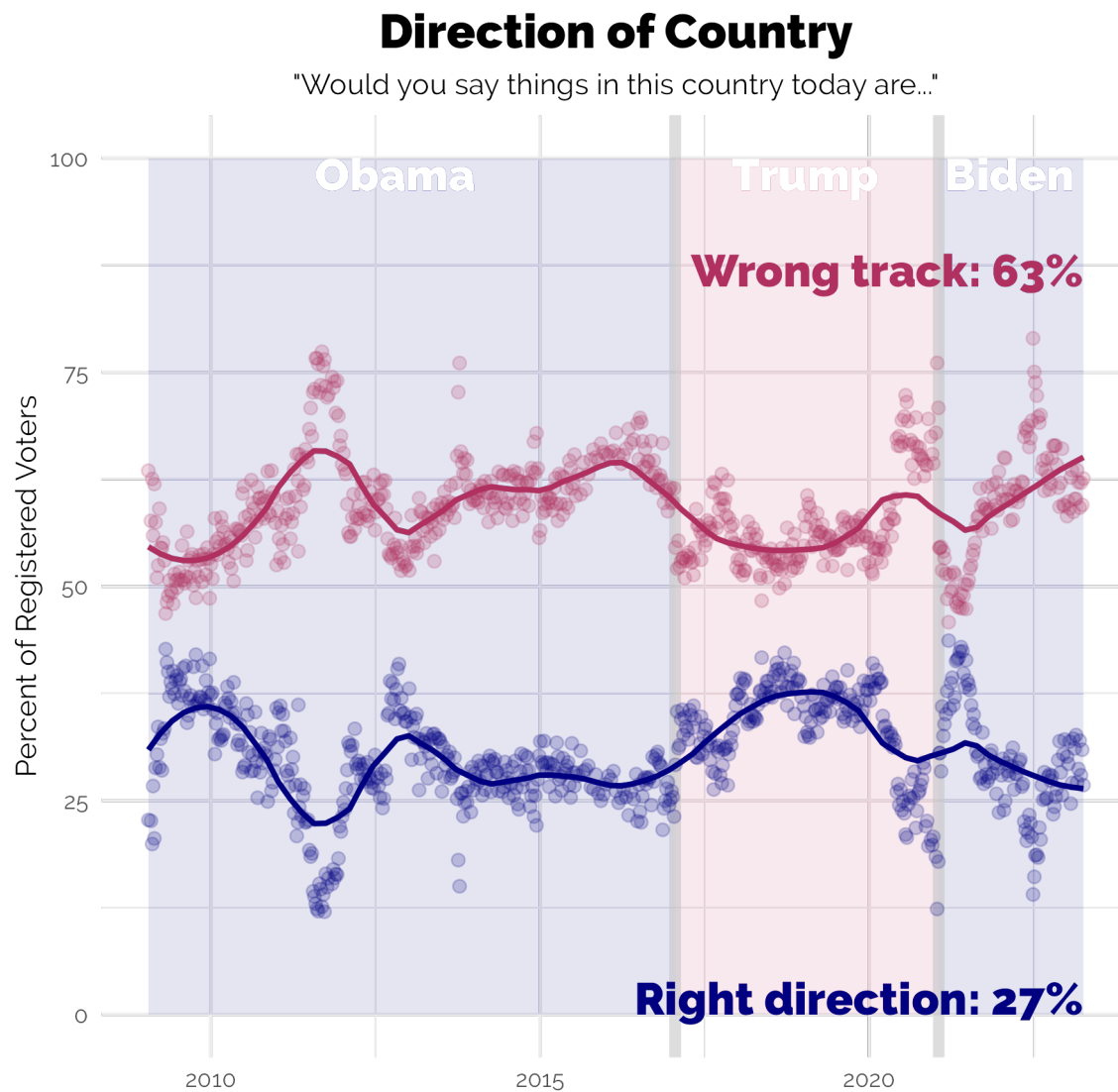


Figure 8: Direction of Country – Registered Voters

Target population:	U.S. citizens, aged 18 and over.
Interviewing Dates:	April 1 - 4, 2023
Sampling method:	Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching. A random sample (stratified by age, gender, race, education, and region) was selected from the 2020 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2020 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
Weighting:	The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, education, 2020 election turnout and Presidential vote, baseline party identification, and current voter registration status. Demographic weighting targets come from the 2019 American Community Survey. Baseline party identification is the respondent's most recent answer given prior to June 1, 2022, and is weighted to the estimated distribution at that time (34% Democratic, 31% Republican). The weights range from 0.06 to 6.55, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.8.
