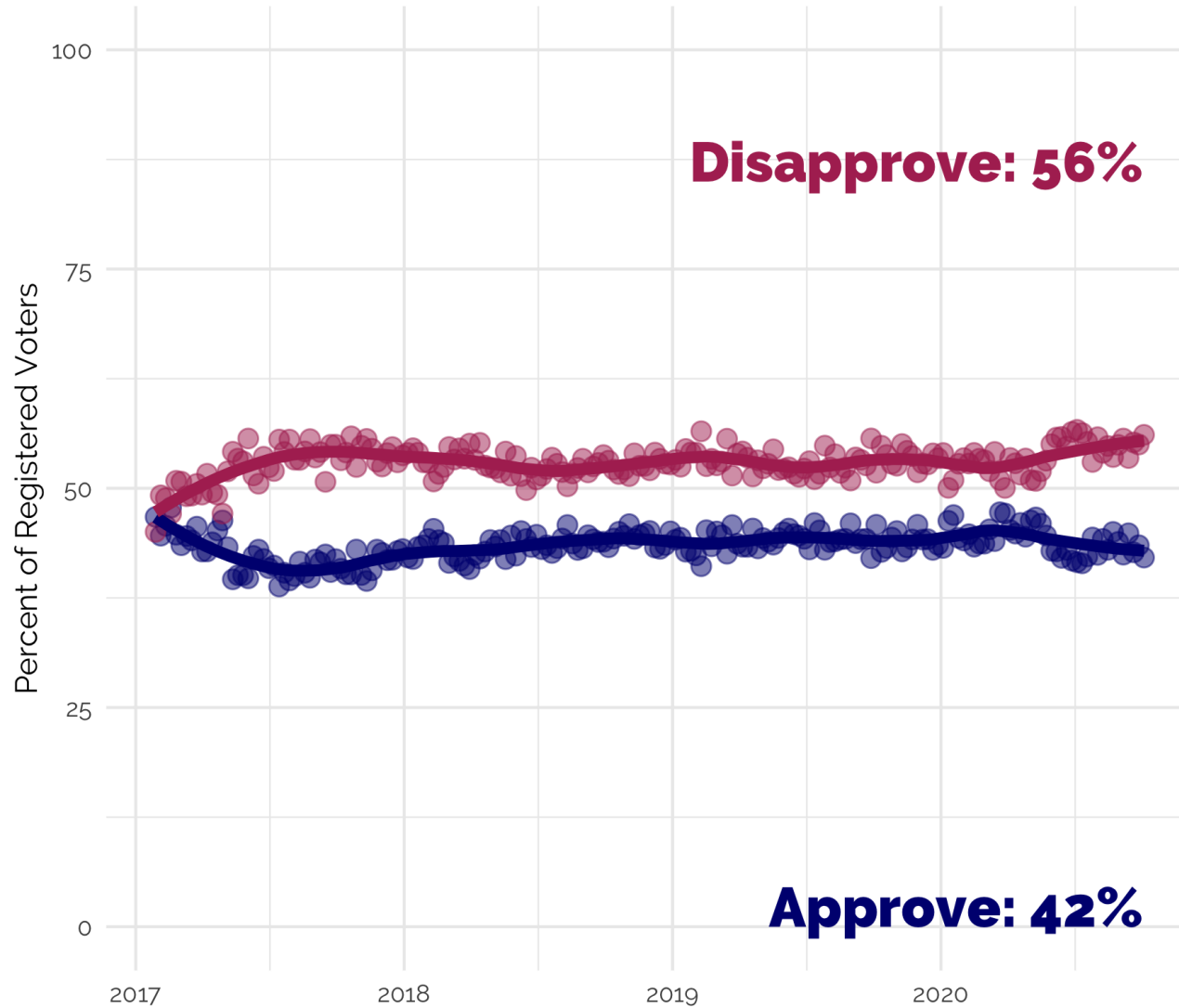


Figure 1: Trump Approval – Registered Voters

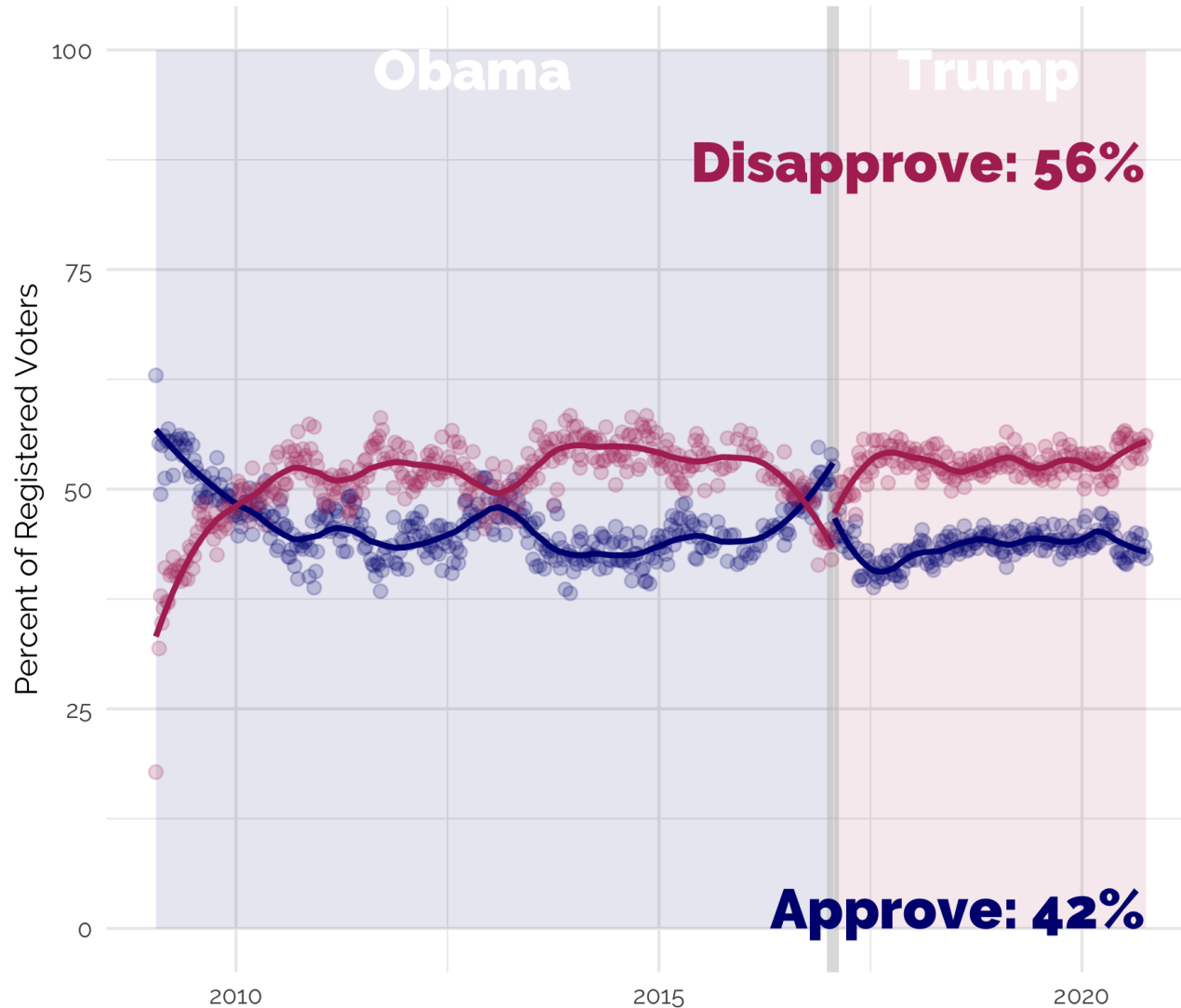


Figure 2: Presidential Approval since 2009 – Registered Voters

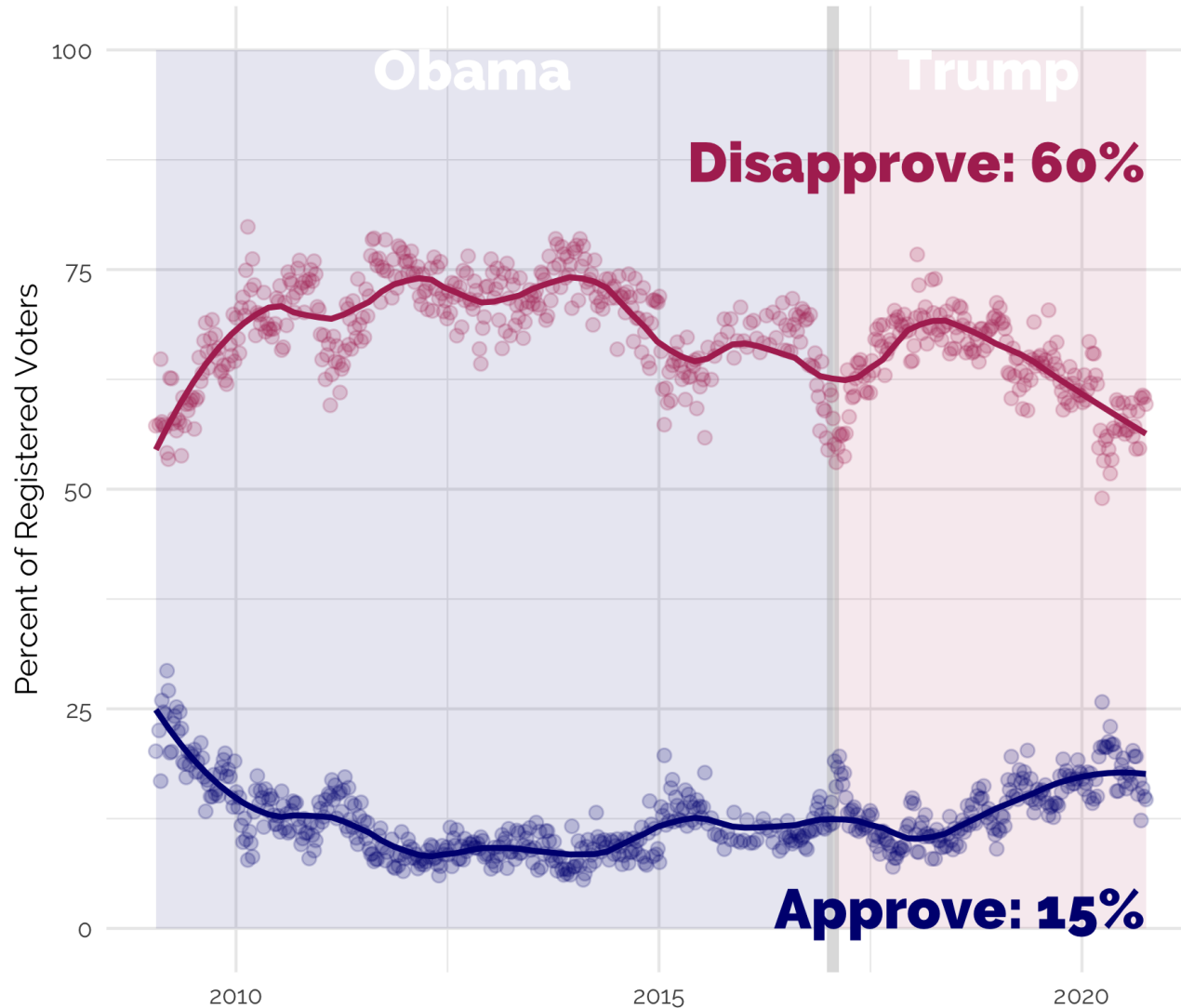


Figure 3: Congressional Approval – Registered Voters

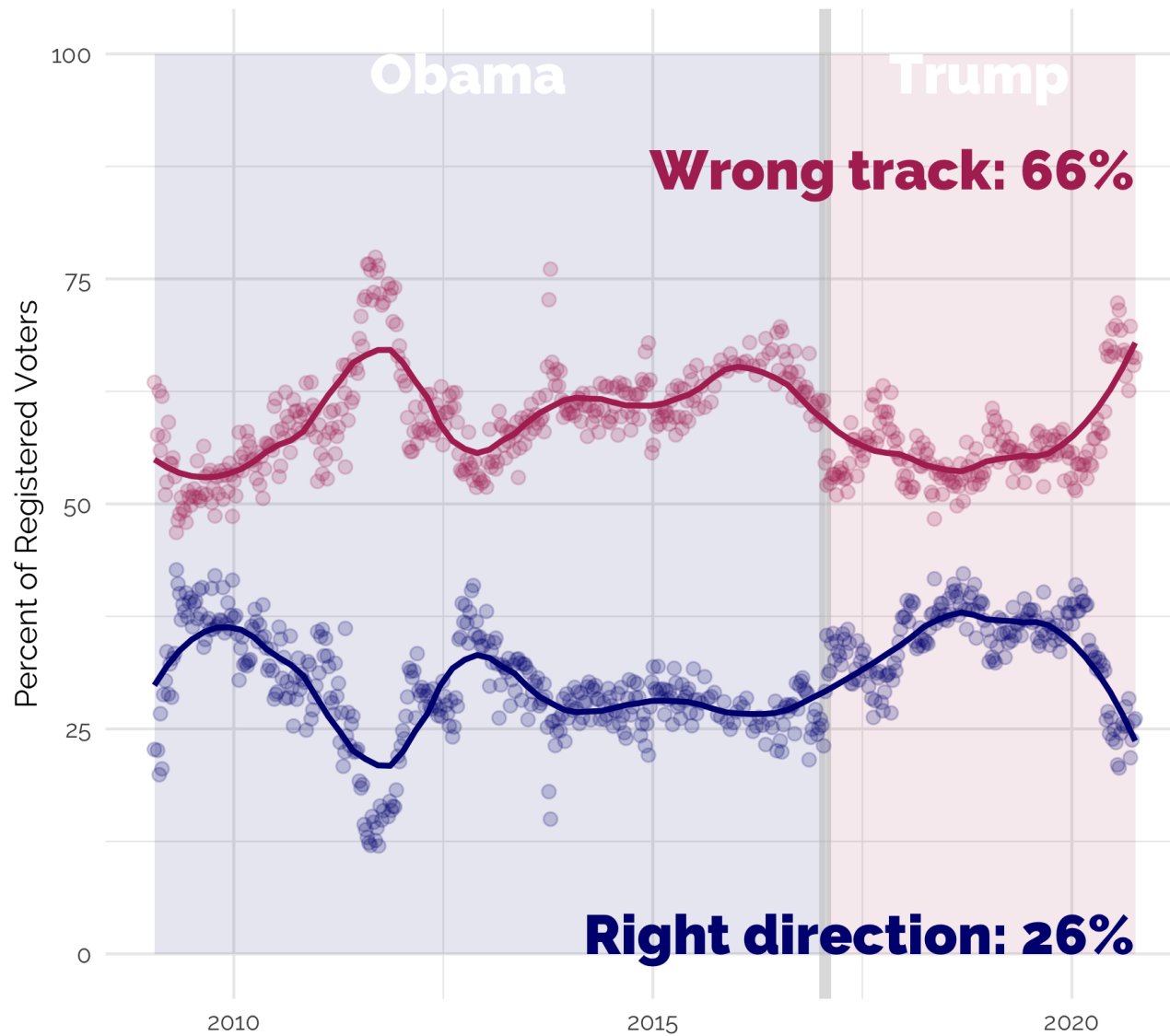


Figure 4: Direction of Country – Registered Voters

Target population:	U.S. registered voters, aged 18 and over.
Interviewing Dates:	October 4 - 6, 2020
Sampling method:	Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching. A random sample (stratified by age, gender, race, education, and region) was selected from the 2018 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2018 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.
Weighting:	The sample was weighted based on age, gender, race, education, and 2016 Presidential vote. The weights range from 0.11 to 7.18, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 1.49.
Number of respondents:	1500
Margin of error (Registered Voters):	4.5% (adjusted for weighting)
Survey mode:	Web-based interviews
