Some banks that are part-owned by the Government, such as RBS, Natwest and Lloyds, are introducing a restriction to their basic bank account holders so that they are only allowed to access their bank accounts from their own bank's cash machines. These banks say that they face a charge per transaction when using another bank's machines and if things were to continue, they would no longer be able to offer a free basic account. However, opponents say vulnerable customers and those living in rural areas may not have the option of other cash machines nearby.
